Kinderhook Runners Club was pleased to present the 23rd running of the Kinderhook OK5K Race, taking over the management from Kinderhook Runners *Inc., following the retirement of the* event's long-time race director, Dan Curtin in 2022.

Dan's shoes, we realize, were not easy to fill and we are grateful that Karen Dolge and Jonathan Loyche agreed to become co-race directors of this beloved race.

Karen is a familiar face in the local running scene, having been a founding member of the Kinderhook Runners Club in 2009 and an accomplished marathon runner who has competed in The Boston Marathon many times.

Jonathan is an ultra marathoner and self-described mountain goat, who recently completed a 100-mile marathon in Thailand. He is also KRC's webmaster.

"We are striving to uphold the standards Dan set that runners have come to expect from the OK5K Race over the years," said Dolge. "We are so excited to be able to keep this tradition going, and are very grateful to have the support of the Kinderhook Runners Club."

Dolge and Loyche also have a clear vision of the future.

"I began my racing journey with a 5K and although I eventually ventured into longer distances, I believe it serves as an ideal starting point for beginners, said Loyche. "The OK5K holds a special place in our community, as it unites generations of runners and walkers. Our vision is to preserve this event's significance; promote the benefits of this wonderful sport, encourage people to stay active, and raise funds for our local non-profit organizations.

Originally founded in 1998 as a race for local runners, the OK5k has since become a larger community event bringing more than 500 runners and their families to Kinderhook on the second

The race has raised more than \$154,900 over the years, and donated more than \$53,000 to the Valatie Food Pantry and \$17,000 to the Marion Stegman Fund to serve the needy in Northern Columbia County. Additional donations are made to Kinderhook Santa Claus Club, libraries in both Kinderhook and Valatie, the Columbia County Historical Society, Valatie Rescue Squad, Boy Scout Troop 113, Kinderhook Trail Committee, sponsorship of Ichabod Crane sports awards night, and the Glencadia Youth Running Club.

We asked James Costello, a long-time friend and fellow OK5K Race committee member, to talk about the race and how Dan came to be its main man.

"The OK5k race, or the
Kindercrafters 5k as it was known in
its early years, was started rather
humbly by local runners Jim Tansey,
Gary Van Allen, John Margan and Jack
Nabozny as a "race by runners for
runners." And in a sense, it has always
retained that character.

In its first year in 1999, the race drew approximately 170 local runners on a course laid out essentially in reverse to today's version. It ended on the back lawn of the House of History where the Kindercrafters was setting up for the day – at that time a much bigger affair. Although a small start, everyone loved it and embraced the goals of continuing and expanding in the future.

Dan Curtin participated as a runner in that first year but not in subsequent years as he joined the organizing committee and soon took over as race director.

As director, Dan ensured that that race retained its original character as a race by runners for runners, while expanding its meaning to include the entire community: runners, walkers, family members, spectators, volunteers, sponsors, businesses, and non-profits. And most importantly and probably his greatest contribution to the race (among his many contributions) was his dedication to fully embracing that community and returning all the revenues from the race back to our local charitable and community organizations: food pantry, libraries, firehouses, police, Boy Scouts, Knights of Columbus, to name just a few.

Dan participated as a runner in that first year but not in subsequent years as he joined the organizing committee and soon took over as race director.



Over the years, the race supported special requests by local school track teams and Santa Claus clubs, among others. The enhancements and additions that Dan and the committee made to the race over the years – including USATF certification, the Kids 1 mile run and Reading Ramble, expanded reach-out to local sponsors, the hand-crafted ceramic awards created by the ICCS Art Club and art classes, the inclusion of student "garage" bands and anthem singers - all made for a better and unique road race while boosting the benefits to the community at large.

Dan's mentorship has ensured the race is left in capable hands, even if it may require several pairs of them to replace his considerable efforts. The new team includes Karen Dolge, who handled donors, vendors and logistics; Jonathan Loyche, who handled registration and communications; and David Durkin, who managed the cadre of volunteers last year.

"I think that the best part of watching Dan operate was he showed me all of the details that a race director has to take into consideration in order to make race day work," said Durkin.

Race volunteer Julie Keating agrees: "Dan has led the race for so long so well in part because he has a way of getting the best out of people.

"He cleverly matches various tasks such as race publicity, day of race registration, course safety, refreshments, announcements, ask me, etc, to the talents of our large number of volunteers. Further, once a task is assigned to you, you are basically free to perform it as you see fit, or in the whirlwind of race morning, as circumstances dictate. In the approximately 15 years I have been volunteering, virtually all of my work or suggestions were accepted by Dan with a quick 'that's fine' or 'sounds good.' His confidence in the OK5k volunteer team makes us comfortable, and empowers us, and keeps us coming back year after year."

And though he wasn't directing, Dan did have a huge presence at the 2023 race.

He finally had the time to run the


